YWCA CALGARY \$50,000



Your support from the 2017 Tournament helps fund the YWCA Mary Dover House Transitional shelter program. MDH includes 86 beds: 6 emergency shelter beds with a maximum stay of 14 days free of charge; and 80 beds of short-term supportive and affordable housing for up to 24 months. Case management and support services are provided to all and include crisis intervention and stabilization, intake screening, assessment, basic needs support, service planning, systems navigation, provision of life skills, housing referrals, and more.

INTENDED OUTCOME

By supporting women to overcome trauma, focus on healing, develop economic stability, and secure affordable housing in the community, then they will start to thrive, be hopeful for their future and develop independence.

INN FROM THE COLD \$50,000

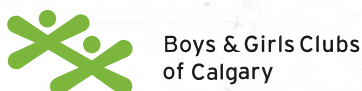


Thanks to your donations, HHTH be the sole funder of 3 projects at Inn From the Cold. We will first replace shelter bed mattresses that promotes quality sleep and also purchase mattress covers that will protect against bed bugs and other allergens. Secondly, HHTH will also fund renovations including painting of the 2nd and 3rd floor of the shelter. Lastly, HHTH will fund the purchase of an automated external defibrillator which will increase the readiness in the event of sudden cardiac arrest of one of their guests.

INTENDED OUTCOME

Quality sleep helps protect mental health, physical health, quality of life, and safety. Painting the second and third floors of the shelter will transform the look and feel of the shelter to benefit homeless children and their families. The defibrillator will improve survival rates and improve the sense of safety and security for all.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUB OF CALGARY \$50,000



With your help, the funds raised will support the hiring of an Independent Living Key Worker for Avenue 15. Avenue 15 offers an alternative to life on the street as well as opportunities that support development for youth ages 12-17. The Key Worker will support youth to achieve their personal goals and to overcome the obstacles and barriers that caused and kept them homeless. They will help youth plan, strategize, follow through on goals, and walk alongside youth.

INTENDED OUTCOME

To continue to tailor their services to end their experience with homelessness. HHTH will continue to help fund the services that will carry them into adulthood and gain the skills and resources they need to be able to exit homelessness as quickly as possible.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY S.A. \$50,000



Funds raised from the 2017 Tournament will help support the Silver Creek legacy build. The Silver Creek legacy build is their largest project to date, featuring affordable homes and a family playground for working families with children. The plans include four buildings with 8-unit stacked townhouses and the requisite parking. Each home is roughly 1100 square feet, with three bedrooms, one and a half bathrooms and an open concept main floor. This project will result in the development of 24 to 32 new homes for families.

INTENDED OUTCOME

Our outcomes include benefits to families, their children, and the community. Families that were once hesitant about becoming active in their communities are now engaged citizens. You are giving our families the gifts of dignity and happiness.
