CONTRIBUTIONS TO END HOMELESSNESS: \$260,000

Since 2014, HHTH Waterloo Region has granted over \$1 million and has funded over 14,000 shelter bed nights locally. In addition, in response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, HHTH Waterloo Region will be granting \$25,000 (\$5,000 each) to our 5 partner beneficiaries in advance of the 2020 HHTH Waterloo Region Tournament. Each of our local partner agencies need our support now more than ever.





















HOUSE OF FRIENDSHIP: CHARLES STREET MEN'S SHELTER | \$65,000

The funds from HHTH will continue to support the costs of their Housing Resource Workers, who are key to caring for the 600 men each year who enter their Shelter. Housing Resource Workers provide them with a variety of supports to help them prepare, secure and maintain a place to call home of their own. These supports include developing an individualized housing plan, determining housing preferences, educating men on their rights, responsibilities and money management, and helping them to make the unit a home.

oneroof youth shelter: Shelter Operations | \$65,000

Funds help operate a youth specific (ages 16-25) shelter with 17 co-ed shelter beds to provide safety, security, and well-being to the vulnerable youth they serve. Not only do they provide beds, but they also offer wrap-around supports such as life skills development, basic necessities, intensive care management, crisis management, family mediation, support, advocacy, and goal-setting.

LUTHERWOOD: SAFE HAVEN SHELTER | \$65,000

Funds will support Lutherwood's Safe Haven Shelter which is a 10-bed shelter for vulnerable youth between the ages of 12 and 18. HHTH donations ensure they are able to maintain staffing to support the youth who access their services, including their life and social skills programming. Youth are provided with their basic needs, and a discharge/housing plan which may include reintegration into their family unit, independent living, or supportive housing options.

YW KITCHENER-WATERLOO: SHELTER OPERATIONS | \$65,000

With your help, the YW Emergency Shelter will continue to operate their 66-bed shelter for homeless women and families. They provide basic necessities, crisis support, housing help, advocacy, information, and referrals to longer-term community supports and services to approximately 400 women and 200 children every year.

CAMBRIDGE SHELTER CORPORATION: THE BRIDGES | NEW FOR 2020

Cambridge Shelter Corporation, The Bridges, provides emergency shelter, supportive housing and other programs and services to individuals experiencing homelessness in Waterloo Region. Working cooperatively with other regional shelters and community agencies, they strive to ensure that everyone has everyone has safe, affordable and accessible housing
